1. Welcome/Roll Call
2. Approval of April minutes
 - a. Done via email
3. How will we promote student engagement on a socially distanced campus?/ How can we promote student success in classes taught remotely and online?
 - a. Dual delivery for classes
 - b. Zip card images submitted by students
 - c. Service areas:
 - i. ID what they can expect from different services on campus
 - ii. Become more specific as Fall semester nears
 - iii. Each support unit expected to deliver in multiple ways
 - iv. Phone/video conferences will be available
 - v. Groups of 10 -> 50 -> 300 based on what they're meeting for
 - vi. We WILL have a welcome weekend; Roofest will be offered digitally and a 'distanced live' format
 - vii. Planning group has designated a student working group -> Kevin is a leader for this
 - viii. Campus drive-in will be offered (movie, concert, etc)

- ix. We will need a rapid response to the series of recommendations moving forward
- x. Measures of student success are going to be different
 - 1. For faculty: how is a student engaged?
 - 2. Will be easier to assess engagement *on campus*, as numbers will be reduced
 - 3. Engagement with 'college life' or academic engagement?
 - 4. Students want some form of campus/classroom experience
- xi. We need to ID our plan for the fall
 - 1. Goals:
 - a. Student engagement on campus
 - b. Student engagement in classroom
 - c. Subdivide these two with undergrad/grad
 - d. Also, engagement with the university
- xii. Do we have appropriate systems for rapid feedback?
 - 1. This committee can be a clearinghouse for that info
 - a. Partner with student working group
 - 2. Set up different types of groups/meetings for students or students/faculty, etc
 - a. Find ways for students and faculty to interact outside of class
 - 3. Bridge the gap between course registration and advising
 - a. Having actual conversations (topics other than strict academics) with students helps them feel more connected
 - b. Seniors helping freshman can be a greater good than faculty helping freshman
 - 4. Certain things may have to be made mandatory, as voluntary suggestions tend to have compliance issues
 - a. Although this is up for debate

5. Reservation based dining can be used to promote special interest group activities

 - a. At some point we need to circle back to the Tiger Team report to demonstrate what we have done for this last year
 - b. Is it worth looking at Gen Ed from a theme perspective?
 - c. Contributing to the ITL HIT series?
 - d. Interaction with counterparts across campus
 - e. Communication with students/texting from individual units
 - i. There is nothing prohibiting texting, but we are limited in what we can say (General Counsel's office)
 1. Who's doing it the best?
 - ii. Certain entities on campus have been told that texting must be done university-wide... we need to make sure what we have been told is correct
5. What are the distancing requirements for one-on-one meetings?
 - a. Each unit, within their current circumstances, need to ID the best criteria to deliver multiple service methods
 - i. Plexi glass generally won't be required/advised to an individual's office
 6. Are there changes to the existing credit/no credit policy?
 - a. This question has not been asked in the relevant meetings yet
 7. Does the university have a threshold for covid cases to return to all digital?
 - a. Summit county will determine this
 - b. Quarantine space will be at Quaker
